FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners of Saint John Bosco:

WELCOME ARCHBISHOP ROZANSKI: We are very happy to welcome you within the first couple of months of your service here as Archbishop of the “Rome of the West.” May the Lord watch over and protect you during your tenure here. May we do all that we can to “serve the Lord with gladness.”

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY: The Archbishop is here because of the observance of World Mission Sunday. The following text is as relevant today as it was almost 100 years ago when “Mission Sunday” was established by Pope Pius XI.

In 1926, Pope Pius XI established an annual collection for the missionary work of the Church worldwide called "World Mission Sunday." World Mission Sunday, organized by the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, is a day set aside for Catholics worldwide to recommit themselves to the Church's missionary activity through prayer and sacrifice.

Offerings from Catholics in the United States, on World Mission Sunday and throughout the year, are combined with offerings to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith worldwide to support 1,111 mission dioceses.

As described by Pope St. John Paul II, World Mission Sunday is "an important day in the life of the Church because it teaches how to give: as an offering made to God, in the Eucharistic celebration and for all the missions of the world" (Redemptoris Missio, 81)

Our Archdiocese has traditionally been one of the most generous to all the missions ... and I know that it will continue. Thank you, in advance, for your generous contributions to the missions. In a sense we also support the missionary work of the Eucharistic Missionaries of Saint Therese, our sisters who serve here, because by what we can contribute to their order helps their missionary and catechetical work in Mexico.

STUDY WEEK: This is being written prior to my departure for the Study Week on the Gospel of Saint Mark. I assure you that I will have some reflections about the Study Week in next week's bulletin.

PLANNING AHEAD: All Saints' Day this year is on Sunday, November 1 (which, by the way is the day our clocks “fall back” an hour). The Mass schedule for that Holyday of Obligation will be the normal, 5 p.m. on Saturday, 8 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. on Sunday. The next day, **All Souls Day**, will have two extra Masses here than in the past. We will have our normal 7 a.m. Mass and I will offer another Mass at **11 a.m.** (please note the time). In addition, there will be a special Mass at **7 p.m.** on November 2 at which we will commemorate all those whose funerals were conducted under the auspices of Saint John Bosco Parish the past year. Each person will have a candle with his/her name on it and the families will be invited to take it home with them to honor their departed loved one. This will be a new tradition that I have done at many other parishes. More details next week!
