It was composed for the inauguration of our first president, George Washington.

We serve over 350 families a month with a nutrient-dense food basket, medical and utility assistance, laundry detergent, pampers, toilet paper, and other items that are otherwise difficult to obtain. Additionally, we have a thrift store open to the public on Fridays and Saturdays. The thrift store provides families the ability to shop for clothing, furniture, household goods, and shoes donated by New Balance.

Annually, we sponsor the Christmas Club. Unlike “adopt-a-family” programs, The Christmas Club’s clients are offered an opportunity to be able to choose from new products to decide what they truly need to make their holiday season magical. However, it does not work unless we have help! With this year’s pandemic truly altering our client’s lives, we would love your help to make this the best Christmas ever for all the families we serve at the Wellston Center.

All gifts are priced at about 10% of the original cost, and families are eligible to shop and purchase these gifts in the Christmas Club.”
